



Sevenoaks Wildlife Reserve shortlisted designs revealed

Shortlisted designs have been unveiled in the competition to find an architect for a £2 million visitor centre at Sevenoaks Wildlife Reserve in Kent. The schemes were drawn up by emerging firms ArkleBoyce Architects, Ben Adams Architects, Studio McLeod with Ekkist, and Bilka de Beupuy – a collaboration between architect Monika Bilka and nutritionist Arabella de Beupuy. The designs went on public display earlier this month but remain anonymous. *RW*

CZWG's 1989 Circle scheme protected with Grade II listing

CZWG's The Circle, a 1989 mixed-use scheme near London's Tower Bridge, has been awarded Grade II-listed status. The 302-home development for Jacobs Island Company, built on former docklands in Bermondsey, was recognised for its 'compelling fusion of Postmodern architectural design and place-making'. *GP*

Al-Jawad Pike seeks planning for social housing in Hackney

Emerging practice Al-Jawad Pike has submitted plans for its contest-winning Daubeney Road scheme, one of Hackney Council's new wave of social housing projects. Providing a mix of two and three-bedroom homes and a four-bedroom family house, the 11-unit, 1,100m² project will replace 25 garages with a red brick-clad 'staggered terrace'. *RW*
